Dear Friends,

President Harry S. Truman once said, "It's amazing what you can accomplish if you do not care who gets the credit." The stories in this annual report showcase many of the accomplishments that the people of Cloud County made possible through their generous giving without caring who got credit. With their strength and commitment to building a better Cloud County, we have continued our mission to impact the lives of others in our communities today while transforming a better tomorrow.

Many of these accomplishments were made possible thanks to the financial assistance from the Dane G. Hansen Foundation matching initiative. In November 2022, we raised \$42,195 for the Impact Fund for Cloud County and the Hansen Foundation matched it at 200% for a total impact of \$126,390 in FY2023.

Since then, we have had the good fortune of adding a grant from the Patterson Family Foundation to the Hansen match and in November 2023, we exceeded last year's amount by \$60,000 raising a total of \$102,867.30 for the Impact Fund for Cloud County and over 40 eligible individual endowed funds. Thanks to the hard work from our board members and the very generous contributions from many benefactors, we received the maximum matches from Foundations (\$100,000 from Hansen and \$70,000 from Patterson), making a total impact of \$272,867.30. This is the largest amount we have ever raised for our match month in our 21-year history!

In addition to growing via our match month, in FY2023 we established three new funds—The Keith Christensen Outstanding Senior Offensive Lineman Scholarship Fund, SMC Blessings Unlimited Fund and the Concordia USD 333 Education Fund.

On behalf of the board of directors, thank you for your continued support of the Community Foundation for Cloud County and our county. It IS AMAZING what has been accomplished!

The grant from the Dane G. Hansen Community Grant Fund helped the Sunset Home Senior Living Community Center move closer to their goal of opening a Childcare Center that will feature intergenerational programming.

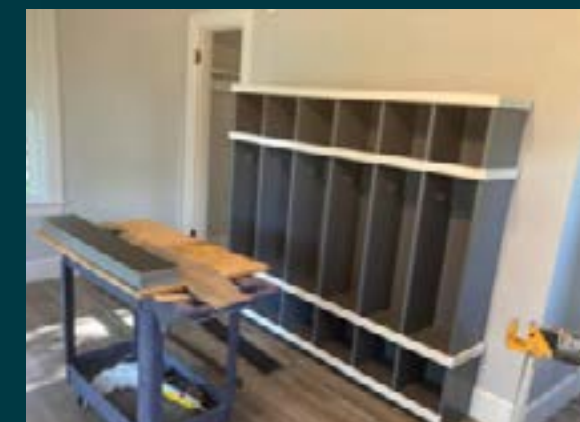
The childcare center will be operated by Sunset Home and was completed Summer of 2023. Sunset Home employees as well as Concordia community members will have the opportunity to enroll their children in a program that focuses on healthy development, learning, and intergenerational activities. The intent is to have children and residents interact regularly to encourage social enrichment and healthy behaviors for all. This is the first phase of a larger project that

will bring formal intergenerational activities to older adults at Sunset Home.

In addition, the project allows Sunset Home to better support employees with young children and recruit more frontline staff by offering childcare from 6 a.m. to 6 p.m.

The funds specifically went to many supplies and furnishings, some of which are cubbies, sleeping cots, educational supplies, toys and a refrigerator.

Thank you to Salina Regional Health Foundation and the Community Foundation for Cloud County for putting Sunset Home closer to realizing this dream!

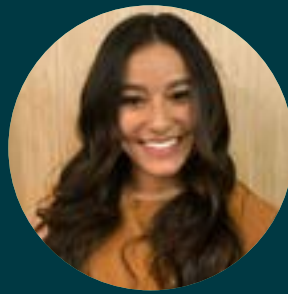

WHAT TO GIVE OTHER THAN CASH

There are many ways to give to the community foundation besides cash including appreciated stocks and securities, retirement accounts, real estate, grain and even cryptocurrency!

Depending on your financial situation, these could be a more tax efficient way to give back to your community and should be discussed with your financial advisor.

Whatever you choose, we want to partner with you to help you impact today and transform tomorrow!



APPRECIATED STOCKS & SECURITIES

- Avoid long-term capital gains tax by donating appreciated stocks or securities that you have owned for over a year.
- Receive a charitable income tax deduction based on the full fair market value of the security.
- Examples include gifts of stock, bonds, and business interests.



RETIREMENT ACCOUNT

- Include the Foundation as a beneficiary of your retirement account. We receive the full amount and pay zero income tax, getting the entire benefit of your gift!
- If you are 70 1/2 or older you can contribute up to \$100,000 from your IRA directly to the Foundation (except for donor advised funds) and avoid paying income taxes on the distribution.



REAL ESTATE

- Avoid paying capital gains tax on the sale of the real estate.
- Receive a charitable income tax deduction based on the full fair market value of the property.
- All gifts of real estate are liquidated with the proceeds of the sale going to the fund of your choice.



GRAIN

- Transfer and donate the grain to the community foundation's account at the grain elevator and the Foundation sells it with proceeds going into the fund of your choice.
- Avoid income tax on the donated grain.
- Deduct the production cost of the donated grain if applicable.



CRYPTOCURRENCY

- Donate your cryptocurrency using The Giving Block platform on our website.
- Avoid capital gains tax on appreciated cryptocurrency held for at least one year.
- Receive a charitable income tax deduction based on the full fair market value of the cryptocurrency.
