From Our **Director**

Dear Donors & Friends.

As we conclude our 17th year in October 2019, the Community Foundation for Cloud County (CFCC) is pleased to recognize the establishment of five new funds. These include two donor advised funds: Steve and Walene Graham Fund and the Bruce and Michelle Graham Fund; a scholarship fund: The Gertrude Whitebread Scholarship Fund; and two organization funds: National Orphan Train Complex Fund and the POW Camp Concordia Fund.

In fiscal year ending June 30, 2019, over \$780,000 of new monies have been invested in CFCC, including \$100,000 for the Dane G. Hansen Foundation Community Grant Fund and over \$79,000 from the one-day Match Madness promotion which had 31 funds participating. CFCC also raised over \$106,500 during the Dane G. Hansen 50K Initiative held in November 2018. The community's investment in the 64 funds in the Foundation as of June 30, 2019 totaled over \$8,150,000. Forty-eight of the existing funds received additional contributions during the year then ended.

Forty-six funds participated in awarding the 131 grants this fiscal year totaling over \$459,500. Since its inception, the Foundation has awarded grants and scholarships totaling over \$3,230,000.

To Create Big Impact

A 'Guardian Angel'

With the help of a community foundation grant, the National Orphan Train complex was able to place a life-size, custom bronze statue of Agent Anna Laura Hill at the corner of 6th Street. and Highway 81. Agent Hill was "truly the guardian angel of the plains," said grantee Shaley George. Agent Hill served as a western placing agent for the Children's Aid Society of New York for approximately 30 years, where she was known for her love for children and desire to find them a safe home.

George expressed the organization's gratitude for the grant support. "The National Orphan Train Complex cannot thank the Community Foundation for Cloud County enough for their continued



support. With their help, we were able to realize our dream of bringing Agent Anna Laura Hill's custom statue home to Cloud County," she said.

Lifetime License to Play Outdoors

The Community Foundation for Cloud County's Youth Impact Fund aided in the purchase of a Kansas lifetime hunting license for the Cloud County Ducks



Unlimited to give away at their annual conservation banquet. This year, they were able to give a lifetime license to three greenwing attendees (under the age of 18). Grantee Joshua Meyer states that the winners were very appreciative, including Peter Newman and his brother Reed, who sent a thank you. "Our goal is to promote the outdoors and pass along the tradition of hunting to a younger generation," says Meyer. "We can't make these events happen without the help of a community and we feel like ours is a pretty good one!"

VFW Honors Service Members with Memorial Day Flag Display

The Avenue of Flags was organized in August of 1976 by the Veterans of Foreign Wars Post/Auxiliary 588 and the American Legion Post/Auxiliary 76 for the community to honor deceased service members. This past year, the committee took on a project to replace 200 removable flag poles with permanently installed poles at Pleasant Hill Cemetery, where volunteers put up and take down the existing poles twice a year on Memorial Day and Veterans Day.

Last spring, the American Legion was awarded \$20,000 from the Dane G. Hansen Community Grant Fund and the Impact for Cloud County to assist in paying for the 200 flags and 20 foot telescopic permanent flag poles.

To complete the project, a volunteer contractor stepped up to oversee the installation, volunteer labor, donated and discounted materials, as well as complementary professional engineering services. The committee

also worked with the City of Concordia Public Works Department to complete the project in the city-owned cemetery, plus recruited city staff and equipment to be utilized without cost.

Due to the help of the community grant fund, as well as the volunteers from the community, the Avenue of Flags project was deemed a success. The Concordia population and surrounding areas are now able to continue to honor over 600 deceased veterans with much less volunteer labor. Current and future generations will have top-of-mind awareness on these two important holidays of how past veterans have sacrificed to protect the freedoms enjoyed by United States citizens.

Grantee Damon Christensen witnessed the project's impact while celebrating this past Memorial Day. "When the flags were flying on Memorial Day, it was an impressive sight standing at the north end of the cemetery, looking up the road, and



seeing all those flags waving in the breeze." he said.

"Putting up and taking down the flags was so much easier than before, and folding the smaller flags took less time than before. I have heard nothing but great reviews from the public."

After year-end, excess donations to the project were used to establish the American Legion Avenue of Flags Fund at the community foundation.

Warrior Central Opens in Miltonvale

On April 1, 2019, the Miltonvale Community opened "Warrior Central," a 24-hour access community fitness center that is open to the public. The Dane G. Hansen Community Grant Fund aided with \$10,000 in the remodel of the building as well as the purchasing of machines for the facility.

The community has already seen an

impact, said grantee Tammera Marrs.

"Individuals now have the ability to exercise at all times of the day. This will have future impact on a healthier community. Not only the young generation, but the older citizens realizing the importance of their health and beginning an exercise program," said Marrs.

Little Free Library



With the support from a community foundation grant, the City of Concordia and Hood Park Neighbors were able to welcome the Little Free Library with open arms, as well as plenty of book donations. "I am grateful to the Community Foundation for Cloud County for awarding this grant, and the positive impact is has made on the community," said grantee Amber Lambertz.

When the weather is nice, a local daycare frequently takes walks to visit and exchange books. "Promoting early literacy is something I care deeply about, and seeing this project provide exactly what I hoped is incredibly fulfilling," said Lambertz.

Emergency Service and Safety

The City of Concordia was granted an award from the Seize the Moment Fund to assist in the purchase of an additional ambulance child restraint (ACR).

These restraints allow young patients to be transported in a more stable manor, preventing further injury. The Concordia EMS provides service to nine of 18 townships in Cloud County and supports the other nine townships when requested. Three of the four ambulances may be on call at any given time, so it is crucial that all ambulances are similarly equipped. Grantee Amy Lange says, "The ACRs funded will have provided a



safer ambulance transport environment when these children need it. This also allows our EMTs to provide better quality service to our patients."

Role Models for the Next Generation

This year, the community foundation sponsored a luncheon for the new Concordia High School mentors. At this luncheon, the mentors listened to a presentation on their roles and expectations of being a mentor. "We believe the more positive role models in our young peoples' lives, the better," grantee Brandt Hutchinson explained. The mentors are made up of community members who have volunteered their time to meet with high school students four times a year, where they will discuss various life skill topics such as financial responsibility, workforce skills, healthy relationships, career/job paths and interview skills. Hutchinson stated. "One



of our goals is to intertwine the Concordia generations to provide opportunities for our young people. This network also has benefits for our alumni and friends, such as providing quality workers or even a potential succession plan."



Students Plant Tulips for a Colorful Campus

The Youth Activity Fund was able to make the Concordia Middle School leadership's vision for enhancing the beauty of the school a reality by granting the funds to plant red and white tulips on campus. Grantee Brandt Hutchinson thanked the community foundation for the support. He said, "Our students were able to learn the value of volunteering

for the betterment of our community. Every year when the tulips bloom, our young people will remember the day they helped make Concordia better. As a community, we are very fortunate to have the Community Foundation for Cloud County. If you see something positive happening in Concordia, the foundation probably has touched it."




